# Sandblast & BBQ

## Rules

- Competition is open to architectural firms, design firms and school teams.
- Only paid registrants can participate in the competition and/or BBQ.
- No food, glass containers or alcoholic beverages are allowed at the competition.
- Families and friends of competing firms/schools are welcome to participate on a team.
- Firms/schools may enter more than one team; however, teams may not combine sites.
- Each site is sized approximately 10' x 10'.
- Each team must bring and post a team identification sign (plus a stake to post it), not larger than 24" x 36", on the assigned site.
- No tents, canvases, tarps are allowed on sites.
- Forms are allowed but must be limited to wood and plastic material due to the possibility of injuries. No metal forms.
- Formwork cannot be incorporated structurally into the sand sculpture.
- Teams must provide their own water carrying and sculpting tools
- No dyes, paint, glue, plaster or the like are allowed on sites.
- Decorative materials are allowed, but cannot be structural and must be biodegradable and non-polluting.
- Teams may fill water containers and set up formwork prior 12:00 pm.
- Teams start moving/carrying/forming sand at 12:00 pm.
- Sites must be cleared of anything other than the sand sculpture at 3:30 pm, this includes tools, trash, personal effects and form work.
- Each team is responsible for clearing its own site after the event.
- All trash is to be disposed of in bins provided, this does not include forms, which must be disposed of off- site.
